Highways

Councilor update - Cllr Townsend provided the following report:



- Vobster - rough surface giving Alton Towers ride, since has been marked up for repair
- Between White Post and Charlton Lane - edge erosion reported and repaired
- Charity Lane - pothole reported and repaired
- Stoke Bottom - pothole on bend reported
- Highbury St - road closure challenged but Highways insisted it was vital for safety purposes.
- Stockhill - removal of Road Closure sign requested

Footpath issues reported:

- Back of Kings Head, FR 4/27, becoming badly overgrown particularly with nettles making it unsafe for the elderly who use it regularly
- Anchor Rd to Farley Dell, possibly FR 4/5, invaded by overhanging beech hedge from No 81 on the south side.

Update on the meeting with Somerset Councilor Philip Ham and Sara Davies Somerset Highways Engineer – The following issues were discussed and it was agreed that the Council would continue to press for action throughout the village roads.

Coleford:

a) Speed indicators sites. Sara Davies Somerset Highways Engineer had highlighted the best locations for the SID at Lipyeate and Stockhill. There was also a discussion as to whether the Council would be better to consider the Evolis Mobile units rather than Evolis Vision which would enable the council to move the unit more easily if it choose to in the future.



b) Floral displays at the village entrance. Sara doesn't like them as they rot but also can be considered a hazard so suggested a wicket gate with a name plate of the village, plant bulbs and flowers and may be a low trough. It was agreed that the council would send the proposed site location for approval.



c) 20mph in Church St. – Sara said this would not be enforced by police but could be implemented if paid for by the Parish Council. Sara said she would look into the siting of new signs like 'No Pavements, Children Playing, Road Narrowing or Narrow road.'

d) 'Keep Clear' sign by Old Coop to be repainted asap this year.

Newbury:

Volume of traffic, speed of traffic, mixing with children with additional needs walking and riding horses from the disabled unit in Hoares Lane, plus guests visiting Luckington Gables, Hobbit Houses, Babington House, five riding establishments and 60+ children attending the school on a daily basis, plus farm traffic combines to make a lethal mix.

Sara said, 20mph signs are not an option as would not be enforceable, but very willing to help by:

- 1) Repainting rumble strips
- 2) Children signs walking / playing, road narrowing or narrow roads, slow signs in road.
- 3) Sara will look into the protocol of use of horses for the disabled and relationship between the two schools and liabilities of both establishments.

Kilmersdon:

Dip in road on the hill of Hoares Lane.

30mph signs to be moved towards Joliffe bridge as agreed in planning permission several years ago.
Manhole sunk in Kilmersdon hill.

Produced several photos of bad signage, Diversion signs at Charlton, signs in the middle of the road near bend on junction of Charity lane onto Mells road. Road closed ahead signs in the wrong place, Sara said she had also noticed bad signage on the way to Coleford. I also complained about the slow and lack of removal of signs. She said she would report back to right team our observations.

MAJOR CROSS ROADS

- Burnt Wood cross roads - This will cost around 4 million.
1st set of plans have been rejected by Sara and other members of her team and they are being redrawn . The farmers who are giving up land were also not happy in the way the drawings were using more land than needed.
- Beacon cross roads - Somerset Council are investigating ways forward for this cross roads thanks to the pressure from the Local Community Networks, many Parish Councils, local haulage firms and Somerset Councillors Clarke, Hobbs and Ham.
- Terry Hill cross roads. - Somerset Council are looking at what can be done here after another fatal accident. Many locals are avoiding this crossing as they are at the Beacon cross roads, Somerset Cllr Ham thought that traffic lights would be the best option here and cheaper than a roundabout.



Lipyate:

We discussed named road signs for Charmborough Lane and Cherry Gardens Lane. Sara would look at the standard maps they use and would add these as locally known names for the abovementioned roads. If the Parish Council want the roads to have signs the Parish Council would need to pay for them
