Highways

The following report highlights the issues actioned since the meeting held on the 8th July:

- Anchor Rd Pedestrian Crossing - original damage repaired, additional damage reported and marked up for action and repaired
- Stockhill overhanging hedges - request for cutting back
- Charmborough Lane overhanging hedges - request for cutting back
- Stock Hill - large pothole reported and repaired
- Beacon View - broken up pavements reported
- Vobster Hill - damaged drain marked up and repaired
- Stoke Bottom - dropped drain by stream repaired
- Stoke Bottom - pothole by Giddy Lane reported and repaired
- Vobster Hollow House - washboard humps partially repaired
- Vobster Hollow House - poor repair made good and pothole opposite repaired
- Preachers Vale - hole in footpath reported
- Dark Lane - pothole repairs completed off Brewery Lane
- Brewery Lane - potholes opposite Dark Lane reported but classified not a safety defect
- Tinkers Lane - some potholes repaired, at last
- Drains - clearance along Charmborough Lane and Stockhill
- Beacon View junction Pedestrian Crossing - brighter lights installed, need to request the same for Anchor Close crossing
- Brewery Lane by Holcombe rec - redundant Road Closed signs removed



Coleford Chair and Somerset Cllr Philip Ham will continue to press Somerset Highways for improvements to reduce speed on both Church Street and at Newbury.

It was noted that the condition of the road surface of Brewery Lane from the Lipyeate crossroads continues to deteriorate and should be raised as a safety concern to the Somerset Highways Engineer.

Highbury Playing Field

Pennys have completed the levelling process with the top soil now in place. We want to thank all the residents for their tolerance during the importation of soil. The Parish Council is now in the process of selecting contractors to prepare and seed the pitch and agree the ongoing maintenance plan. Let's hope that the weather is kind to us and we get some rain when we need it to get the grass seed to grow.



Conversations have started with the Football club regarding making improvements to the changing rooms as it does not currently reach the required standards to play in a higher league. This would also be the case if a youth team or women's team wanted to use the facilities in the future.

Saturday Bus Service

We are pleased to hear that the Saturday bus service is to be reinstated, which will see 4 buses running from Frome to Midsomer Norton. The timetable has been added to the Parish Council website, Facebook page and noticeboards.
